EDITORIAL

The Swallows in the garage have successfully raised one brood of 5 chicks, and a second brood (of 4 we think) are starting to put their heads above the parapet. They have recently clearly been unhappy and uncomfortable with the heat high up under the garage roof, but seem to be more comfortable now.

Hedgehogs report. All 5 of the hoglets (see last month's entry), having each weighed around 50g when they were found, had, by 3 July, and under the expert care of Smudges Hedgehog Sanctuary in Newnham, all reached between 500g and 600g and were ready for release. As the Jones's were by this time engaged in building work around their lambing shed it was decided to bring the hoglets to us where they were put into a run kindly provided by Claire of Smudges in a shaded and secluded part of our garden. There they stayed for a few nights before it was decided to release them, simply by leaving the door of the run open. On the first night 3 of them had moved on, with the other two following the next night.

Since then we have (as advised by Smudges) continued to leave out some food and water. The food tended to disappear during the night, but we didn't know who was taking it. We therefore set up the trail camera and found that while the hedgehogs were indeed the most frequent visitors quite a lot of the food was being consumed by the dratted local cats!!! So in desperation we have now constructed another, hopefully cat-proof, feeding shelter. (My tendency to hoard old bits of kitchen and garden equipment is now proving its worth!)

In the last few days however we have several times seen one of the hoglets coming out and snuffling round the food trays in the early evening.

We still have a great number of goldfinches crowding our bird feeders and we are now enjoying watching them feeding their young on top of the feeder. It's a delightful sight.

We also have this year at least one family of Greater Spotted Woodpeckers who appear to have raised a family and are now coming to feed regularly.

I couldn't resist including this photograph taken by one of our grandchildren recently while on holiday in the West Country. Intro-



ducing (or maybe re-introducing) such a name makes a refreshing change from some po-faced local authorities who seem to delight in removing this sort of evocative historical descriptions.

And finally, I am currently reading Fergus Butler-Gallie's book *"Field Guide to the English Clergy; A Compendium of Diverse Eccentrics, Pirates, Prelates, and Adventurers; All Anglican, some even Practicing."*

Well worth a read!

**CHARWELTON'S FIRST FLOWER FESTIVAL
40 YEARS AGO**

On Saturday and Sunday 2nd. and 3rd. August 1986 Charwelton's first flower festival took place. The flower festival was the culmination of months of historical research and fund raising for the flowers. Friends from our surrounding villages were co-opted to help with the flowers.

The festival basically told Charwelton's history in flowers. The arrangements included the two monasteries, the windmills and water mill, the deserted village, the Andrewes family, the Chapel of the Good Shepherd, the bells, and more. I remember that on Saturday 2nd. August we had a stream of visitors, however, despite being a wet day, visitors were queuing to come into the church under a sea of umbrellas.

Sylvia Baldry, Pauline Donnelly, Mabel and Bill Stansfield, June Pound, Sylvia Neale, Ellen Houldey, Graham White and others had attended flower arranging classes for several months. The Festival was a great success. There were produce stalls in the green barn, and country dancing by a local school.

It is hoped that this year's Harvest Festival decorations can truly reflect this 40th Anniversary.
